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

Studying Animal Management at WUC is the ideal way to explore the diverse career opportunities available to you in the animal industry.

There is an emphasis on animal science alongside practical learning covering topics such as husbandry, conservation and wildlife, zoo and exotic animals, and kennel and cattery management. During your studies, you'll combine theory with hands on learning to understand biology, anatomy, physiology, ecology and behaviour, as well as learning how to look after different species' basic living and nutritional needs.

You will also practice basic veterinary nursing skills such as applying bandages or practicing techniques for safely restraining different animals, in addition to developing vital skills in customer care and business management.

If you are passionate about a career in Animal or Veterinary Science, our pathway in Animal Science will provide you with the necessary skills and experience to allow you to develop a career in this exciting sector.

There is an emphasis on animal science alongside practical learning covering topics such as husbandry, wildlife and ecology conservation, and exotic animal health and husbandry. During your studies, you will delve into fundamentals of science, biochemistry and microbiology, ghemistry, inheritance and genetics and you will undertake a science investigation – and apply all the theory you learn to a practical investigation.

You will also learn how to safely handle and care for a wide range of species and to maintain and promote their health by looking after their basic living and nutrition needs, in addition to developing vital skills in customer care and business management.

 You will study a range of modules including animal health and husbandry, animal behaviour and communication, biological systems of animals, animal welfare and breeding, biochemistry and microbiology.

Where will this take me?

 This programme is equivalent to 3 A-Levels in Science subjects and allows you to progress on to university to study Veterinary Medicine, Veterinary Physiotherapy, Bioveterinary Science or Animal Science.

Dog Grooming

Are you ready?

Study Dog Grooming at WUC and you will learn about all aspects of the dog grooming industry such as Kennel Club breed groups, how to care for different coat types, how to recognise and care for skin conditions, parasites and infectious diseases and essential first aid for dogs.

Our professional facilities feature our commercially run on-site dog grooming parlour, where you will benefit from real life casework during your practical lessons. You will practise techniques such as bathing, drying, caring for ears, eyes, skin and nails, using and looking after equipment including combs, scissors, and clippers.

You will also learn how to plan and design a grooming parlour and study basic business and management skills, as well as key legislation.

Equine

Are you ready to pursue your dreams?

If you have some experience of horses and want a career in the equine industry, we have the resources and expertise to prepare you with the practical skills, knowledge and academic understanding you need to achieve your goals.

By studying at WUC, you will spend most of your time on our dedicated equine campus which is home to around 50 horses, including those for riding. In the core modules of the courses you will learn about equine health, stable routines and tack fitting, but you will also study diverse and innovative units such as equine behaviour and therapy, horse training techniques, the biological systems of a horse, and event management.

You will develop practical skills such as grooming, clipping, riding and lunging as well as equine first aid. Yard duties are also a key part of every course.

Veterinary Nursing

Are you ready for the challenge?

To study Veterinary Nursing at WUC, you will be interested in animals, biological sciences, anatomy and physiology. You will be good at problem-solving and be prepared to uphold a position of responsibility in a complex and highpressured environment.

This course is a work-based qualification; to apply you must already be employed as a student veterinary nurse in an approved training practice. There, you'll complete 1,800 practical hours and will attend WUC one day a week. On this work-based course, you will learn important practical skills including administering medication, taking x-rays, monitoring anaesthetics, minor surgical procedures such as suturing, in-patient care, applying bandages and dressings, taking observations and maintaining records of treatment.

You will also gain experience in a laboratory, examining bloods and other samples for bacteria and viruses.

Grow your potential

Feeding the world's growing population and managing sustainability, whilst maintaining landscapes, that of amenity gardens or public greenspaces, we rely on for relaxation and well-being, are the challenges addressed by our horticulture courses.

Choosing a Horticulture course at WUC you will learn about, Historic heritage, garden design, hard and soft landscape application, plant and soil science, plant production, species identification, estate management, and construction.

You will gain in-depth knowledge and hands-on experience understand the application of seed sowing, planting, propagation, dividing flora species for the principles of ornamental, medicinal and sustenance, as well as learning the principles and practices of garden and landscape design, using a range of modern landscape techniques and materials in our amenity building focusing on the pressing issue of sustainability within horticulture. 



Disability support

We welcome applications from students who have a disability, learning difficulty and/or mental/medical health conditions, and actively encourage early disclosure of support needs. This helps us consider reasonable adjustments and/or allows us to look to put in place some additional support for you right from the start of your course if you are likely to need it. We are based in the FE Learning Hub upstairs in the Library for all FE students. Our team of learning support assistants offer general support in class, group work, 1:1 support and booked sessions. We offer transitional/familiarisation visits over the year for new students to get to know us, for a smooth transition into college. Flexible approach to support as and when needed.

If you are deaf or hearing impaired, we can provide one to one support to assist you throughout your course. We have our own specialist team of communicators who can provide British Sign Language (BSL), Sign Supported English (SSE), note-taking or a combination of all three.

Communication support can be available for off-site visits, tutorials, one-to-one sessions, open days and interviews. Our two largest teaching spaces are also fitted with hearing loop systems.

Course costs

If you are attending a fundable full-time course and are under 19 years of age on 31 August in the year the course commences, then no course costs are payable.

Most students aged 19 or over on 31 August in the year commencing the course are required to pay course costs; however, some learners may be entitled to 100% reduction on tuition fees. The reduction does not extend to full cost courses.

Money worries?

Students who find themselves experiencing financial difficulties can apply to our Further Education Bursary fund, once they have commenced studies. Depending on your situation, we may be able to provide financial support to assist with travel, course related costs, meals and childcare.

If you live in halls of residence and are aged over 18 years we may also be able to help with the cost of hall fees or also private lodgings (not with parents/guardians/ carers).

16-19 Free Meal Award:

Free meals can be awarded to students who were in receipt of a free school meal, evidence is required.

16-19 Discretionary Bursary:

The bursary is awarded to those students with low household incomes, evidence is required.

16-19 Vulnerable Student Bursary:

This bursary is for students within one of the following groups:

- Aged 16-17 and in care of the local authority (living with foster carer(s))
- Aged 16-18 and leaving care
- Aged 16-18 and in receipt of Income Support, Universal Credit, ESA, DLA or PIP

16-19 Residential Bursary Fund:

WUC will only accept students of 18 years and above in halls of residence. A contribution of up to £4,000 can be made towards hall fees or private lodgings. Household income evidence will be required.

Care to Learn

Care to Learn is for students aged under 20 years who require assistance with childcare fees and associated travel costs in order to study at college. The young parent must be the main carer and in receipt of Child Benefit for the child(ren).






